

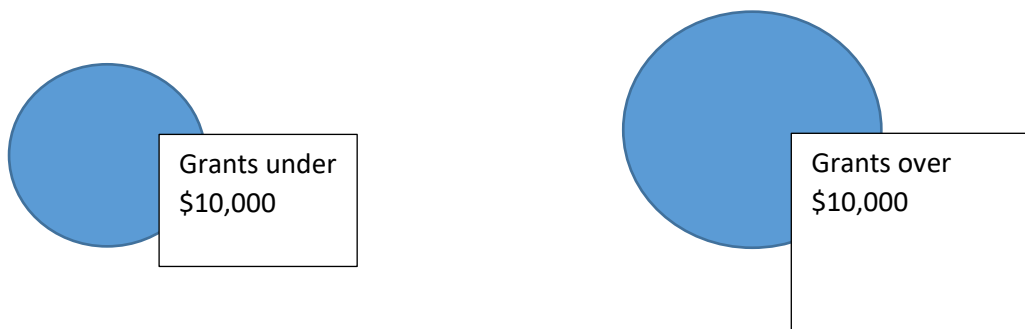


Please read before you apply to Sanford 10 cents a Salmon Fund

Find out if you're eligible for funding and learn about our decision making process.

Process

Decide if your application is for a small grant (under \$10,000) or large grant (over \$10,000) and download an application form.



Fill in the application and email it to us at salmongrant@sanford.co.nz

The success of your application will depend on how well you meet the eligibility criteria below, and on merit when compared to other applications.

Please note that if the fund receives more requests than money is available, not all applications will be successful. Funding is not guaranteed through meeting the criteria and funding is limited.

Am I eligible?

You can apply to the **Sanford 10 cents a Salmon Fund** if your project meets the following criteria:

- The project is focused on the wellbeing of people and communities of Stewart Island and Bluff
- The project is community-led (i.e. not government departments and local authorities)
- The project will be funded for up to 3 consecutive years, then you will need to reapply.

What do we mean by wellbeing?

This fund is to help Stewart Island and Bluff communities. We want to help you bring people together and promote fun, happiness, pride, care and safety. If you need funding for a community



led project, sport, art, culture or health you should apply. This is not a fund for environmental projects.

How will my application be assessed?

Your application will be assessed on:

- The extent to which the wellbeing of the people and communities of Stewart Island and Bluff will benefit
- The extent to which the project engages volunteers, the community and other stakeholders in the delivery, success or enjoyment of the project
- The likelihood of success – demonstrating you have the required skills and capability to deliver the project and providing a reasonable and realistic project budget.

Key dates

Applications open each year on the **01 February** and close 8 weeks later at 5pm on the **31 March**
